

Time as they say marches on, and the older you get the quicker it marches. I find it hard to believe I am now well into my second year as parish priest of Saint David's and Saint Anne and Saint Luke's; to say nothing of Saint David's High School and Shotts Prison!

I am surprised how quickly I have settled in and settled down. As you know I had serious reservations about coming back into an area I grew up in and was educated in. Reservations completely unfounded because of the very warm welcome from both parish communities. It was that, without doubt, that made such a difference.

New times, challenging times.

We are in the middle of the Cardinal's consultation process, and the road ahead still a bit uncertain for all of us.

However my experience from both communities has been to go forward confidently and that is what we intend to do.

It seems to me any parish is made up of two main areas: Spiritual and Social.

In terms of Spiritual:

Our week day Masses, our gathering on Saturday Vigil and Sunday morning to keep faithful to the command of Christ: to gather, to listen to the Word, to be nourished by the Eucharist.


In addition, our celebration of all the other Sacraments remind us of who we are and who we identify with.

In terms of Social:

Happily we have a large group of committed and willing parishioners. Building on the very successful

Youth Mass, we plan on holding something similar in Advent. We are, with our Youth, actively looking to Lourdes 2008, the one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the apparitions



and we would like our Youth represented.

In addition, plans are in hand for a joint Bowling night with youth from Our Lady and Saint Bridgets, West Calder and their adult helpers,

Preparation is well under way for our Nativity Play.

More generally we looking to holding a seventies disco night for those of that vintage! I am keen also to begin a Men's Club, which I believe we already have in emerging form.

The highlight for the parish this year will be the formal visit of Cardinal O'Brien to present to our long serving Organist, Mr. Frank Nicholson, the Bene Merenti Medal in recognition of years of outstanding service to the parish family.

In addition, the Cardinal will also bless our newest Stained Glass window to commemorate the Parish celebrating 150 years in 2005.

Following the Mass that evening there will be the opportunity for the parish to gather socially in our hall and continue our celebrations.

So we thank God for all that has happened in the past and whatever lies ahead we embrace together in hope, joy and confidence.

St. David's High School

A NEW SESSION IN ST. DAVID'S HIGH SCHOOL

St. David's High School enjoyed a very positive start to the new session in August. Our new S1 have settled very well into school and have been helped by their S6 'buddies' to get used to high school life. We also welcomed 10 new members to our teaching staff in August and hope they enjoy their career in St. David's.

At the end of June, a group of senior pupils and staff visited the SCIAF Project St. David's supports in Bangalore, India – The Association of People with Disabilities. We raised £20,000 for this project last year, a sum which was matched by Sir Tom Farmer. Our school party visited the education and training programmes which our funds have helped to support. We will be welcoming a return visit of staff from Bangalore to St. David's at the end of October.

In June we ran another successful Community Festival for all of the associated primaries and parishes attached to St. David's. This event is part of our programme to develop links with our communities across Midlothian and East Lothian. In December, we will be having another Christmas Celebration for senior citizens in school. Our pupils will prepare and serve lunch and provide entertainment for about 70 senior citizens invited from our wide community. Last December, we were

delighted to welcome a group from St. David's Parish for this happy school event.

As you can see, we have had a busy start to the new session. We hope to see you at some of the events detailed in our newsletter, which is also sent to every parish.

Our School Chaplaincy Programme has now been agreed and includes pupil and staff retreats, liturgies, Masses, a trip

News from Parish Groups

Piety Stall

The Book Stall at the back of the church was started about 5 years ago. The Late Canon Healy asked us to sell some Christmas Cards for the Sisters at Humbie. This later resulted in us getting C.T.S. Booklets for sale. Some men of the Parish partitioned this area off so we are able to put up pictures from the primary school and also posters of interest. We have now started to sell Confirmation and 1st Communion Cards, Books & Rosaries.

Shortly we hope to have some new C.T.S. Booklets and the new Catechism for sale. It is now time to order our Christmas Cards once again. We get them from the Carmelite Sisters, Fife and from C.B.S., Ireland. We hope for continuing support from the Parish.

Youth Group

The Youth of St. David's have always played a vital role in our community, from serving on the Altar to reading at Holy Mass or attending the Children's Liturgy. Our young people are seen not only as youngsters who serve our Parish but are the future of our Parish.

A committee was set up which comprised a cross section of the youth together with adult helpers lead by Father Allan. The aim of this group is to look after not only the religious but also the social aspects of our Parish youth. During our first year we have achieved the following:-

- 1. Nativity Play for Primary school children
- 2. Bowling night for Secondary school children
- 3. Youth Mass for all ages
- 4. Games night to end our school year

All these events were a huge success, thanks mainly to the hard work and enthusiasm of the youth themselves. For this new session we have a variety of events in mind; the annual Nativity Play, a visit to the theatre, a number of fund raising events which will hopefully raise the necessary funds to enable the trip to Lourdes in 2008 become a reality.

St. Vincent de Paul Society

The St. David's Conference of the St. Vincent de Paul Society continues its visiting activities and program of events. This currently includes the St. Vincent de Paul Anniversary Day at Carfin, a festal occasion celebrated with Rosary Procession and Holy Mass. Other events include the senior citizens Dobbies outing, a possible sale of work in the St. David's Church hall, and the senior citizens

Christmas party, again in the Church hall.

Following the recent events in Lebanon and the devastating conflict in that region the St. David's Conference has been able to help St. Vincent de Paul Society work in Lebanon and the Holy Land through the St. Vincent de Paul National Council of Scotland.

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul in Scotland now has its own website. This is **www.ssvpscotland. com** Visitors to the site can view the text of Pope Benedict's first encyclical "God is Charity", as well as other items specific to the Society.

Pro Life

The Pro-Life group are delighted to take this opportunity to thank you for supporting us in many different ways over the years.

Until now we have participated in several different Pro-Life campaigns as well as collecting clothes and equipment and giving financial help to groups such as:-

- Fr. Tenase a Rumanian Orthodox priest who runs a home for children and pregnant mothers;
- "Mary's Meals" providing one square meal a day for children in third world countries;
- "Zoe's Place" a Hospice for seriously ill children and their parents, run by Jack and Nuala Scarisbrick, two very prominent Pro-Lifers;
- as well as nearer to home, SPUC, "Lifeline", "Life" West of Scotland, and the "Cardinal Winning Pro-Life Initiative", these four to be our main beneficiaries this year.

We hope, once more to begin praying the White Flower rosary once a month from November and would welcome anyone wishing to join us. On December 28th the Mass of the Holy Innocents takes place concelebrated by the Cardinal, venue yet to be arranged.

Children's Liturgy

The Children's Liturgy is enjoyed by between 15 – 35 of our young people each week. The age range is 4 to 12 years. The children seem to enjoy their weekly gatherings and are disappointed when the liturgy does not take place during the school summer vacation. They certainly look forward to and enjoy their Christmas party.

The adult leaders are made up of volunteers from the parish. At present there are 14 leaders, which means they are not on duty too often throughout the year. New leaders are always welcome. Guidance is given by Sister Monica before new leaders are asked to take up their duties.

Finance Committee

This group look after the Finances of the Parish. We will be directing income and expenditure to enhance our community both spiritually and socially. We have made great strides already on the income side, by trebling the number of people taking part in Gift Aid, which gives us a further income stream from the tax we can reclaim on parish contributions. We are currently planning expenditure to ensure we direct our funds in the most effective way for the parish - eg Buildings and Garden maintenance, funding for parish activities and events.

Eucharistic Ministers

There are a group of 21 Eucharistic Ministers at present in the parish. Ministers are trained and commissioned by the Parish Priest. Communion under both kinds is distributed in St. David's at the Saturday Vigil Mass and Sunday morning Mass. Ministers are on duty at both masses on a rotational basis.

Eucharistic Ministers also visit the sick and housebound in their homes, in care homes and hospitals to distribute the Blessed Sacrament at the request and under the supervision of the Parish Priest.

How clean is Your Church

Wednesday is cleaning day! How often do your friends hear that, whenever they ask how about going wherever on Wednesday morning. No Can't! However nothing is written in stone. Our cleaning team consists of six people, but we are not always able to be there together for various reasons. The cleaning is actually fun, we clean, dust, polish, mop do brasses and we chat a lot. At the end we have a cup of tea and chat some more and we often have some of Margaret's wonderful shortbread! We need more volunteers, it need not always have to be a regular commitment, come when you can. If you do have some time to offer see the gaffer, Margaret. She will keep you right, she keeps me right. How about a big effort in the autumn coming up to Christmas, to have a blitz perhaps in preparation for the Cardinal's visit. At the moment we have no time for extras, we start and finish at the same point every week. As a group we have a common bond and that is our commitment to the job and our pride in seeing the church looking nice. We may not pass an Aggie and Kim inspection but we do our best with limited resources and an average age of 68. Wouldn't you like to be part of our team?

Bene Merenti Medal has been awarded to Frank Nicholson for devoted services to the Parish. The presentation to Frank will take place during the 7.00 p.m. Mass on Friday November 17th.

Stained Glass Window to celebrate our 150th anniversary was installed in early Summer and

will be blessed by the Cardinal during Mass on November 17th.

After 150 years standing, as a place of worship and spiritual nourishment, St. David's parish commemorated in this artistic medium what the Universal church was passing through at the same time. And with this in mind there were three subjects to depict: St. David's 150 years; The



year of the Eucharist; and the remembrance of Pope John Paul II. Three subjects that are infiltrated in one main subject - The Eucharist/Service.

- Look out for fund raising events to support.


